We can’t do this the way we planned.’ We quickly discovered that it wasn’t about crafts, Bible stories, and skits, but it was all about building relationships with broken people and each other. There is a bond in Christ with our ladies’ small group that cannot be broken. This experience has made us stronger as we yielded to God’s plan.



“When I came to St. Mark’s as a soon-to-be widow, I was desperately searching for “what next.” I was invited into a small group of four married couples. I thought this was crazy! As a widow, I am going to be a fifth wheel. But they quickly embraced me and my life was forever changed. **God showed us that it was all about relationships with Him and each other.** We study God’s word and pray for each other, caring for each others needs, and even cry together. We enjoy a bond of God’s richest blessing that cannot be broken.

“I cannot imagine my life without my two small groups. When there is a need, an email goes out to each other, and you can feel the prayers going up immediately. God has richly blessed me through these people. If you would like to experience this joy, I urge you to give a small group a try. You too will be blessed, as well as be a blessing to others, and your faith will grow beyond imagination.”

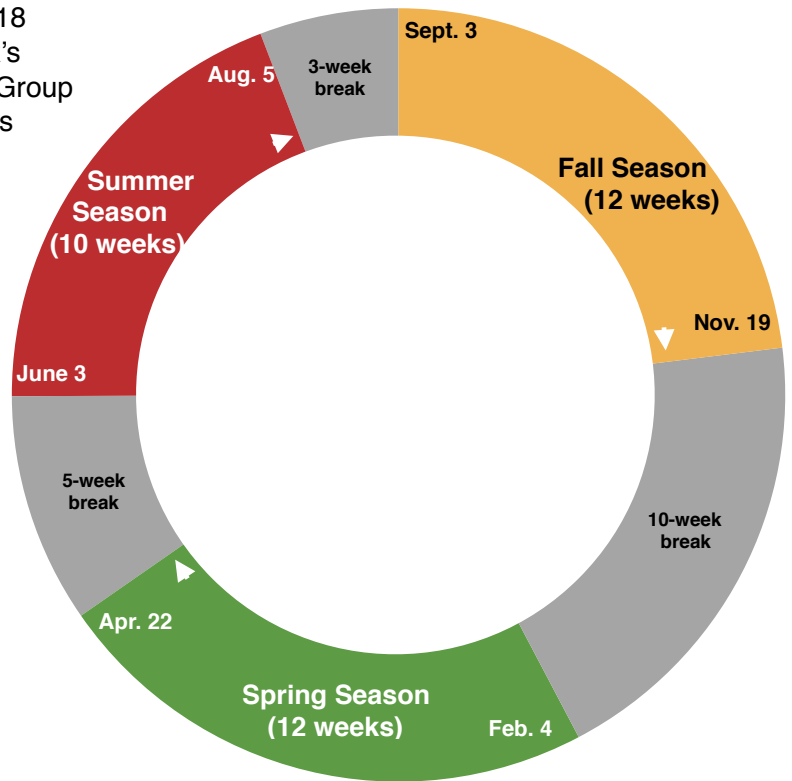
## Fall Kickoff for Community Groups

### Congratulations Grad!

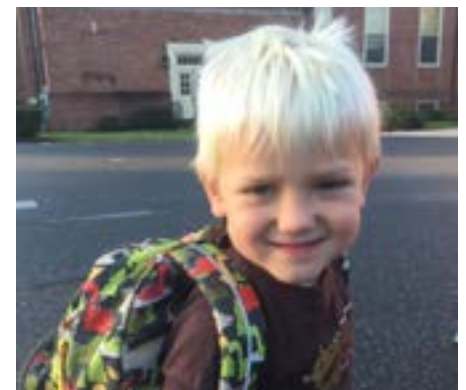

Would you like to get to know people at St. Mark's better? Would you like to be part of a team that serves others while developing relationships with the people on the team? St. Mark's food ministry is looking for volunteers to help with the Sunday Fellowship Dinners, the Free Community Dinners, and St. Mark's Cafe.

On June 11, St. Mark's Sunday Fellowship Dinners completed 17 years of serving good home cooked foods to our dinner guests! This past year (October thru June) more than 2400 tickets were sold to the Sunday Fellowship Dinners and the dinners raised more than \$13,600 for St. Mark's and missions. June also marked the completion of 7 years of St. Mark's serving monthly free community dinners. During the past 9 months (not including November's free Thanksgiving Day Dinner which served about 450 dinners) more than 900 people enjoyed delicious home-cooked meals through our Free Community Dinner Ministry. Several years ago volunteers from Mary Mother of the Church starting helping us serve these dinners - without their help we would be scrambling for volunteers!

The Cafe, which is open each Sunday from 8:30 - 10:45 AM, provides a place for our members, friends, and guests to meet for a time of fellowship and to connect with one another while enjoying light refreshments.

Volunteers are needed to donate desserts, prepare, cook, and serve the meals, as well as wash dishes and cleanup following the meals. We are also looking for a team of 3 or 4 people to take charge of setting-up and tearing-down tables and chairs for the Free Community Dinners.

The lift was here as part of the preliminary work needed to create the specs for the bell tower and roofing project. The planned work to the bell tower includes repairs to the masonry, the slate roof and the flashing around the tower. 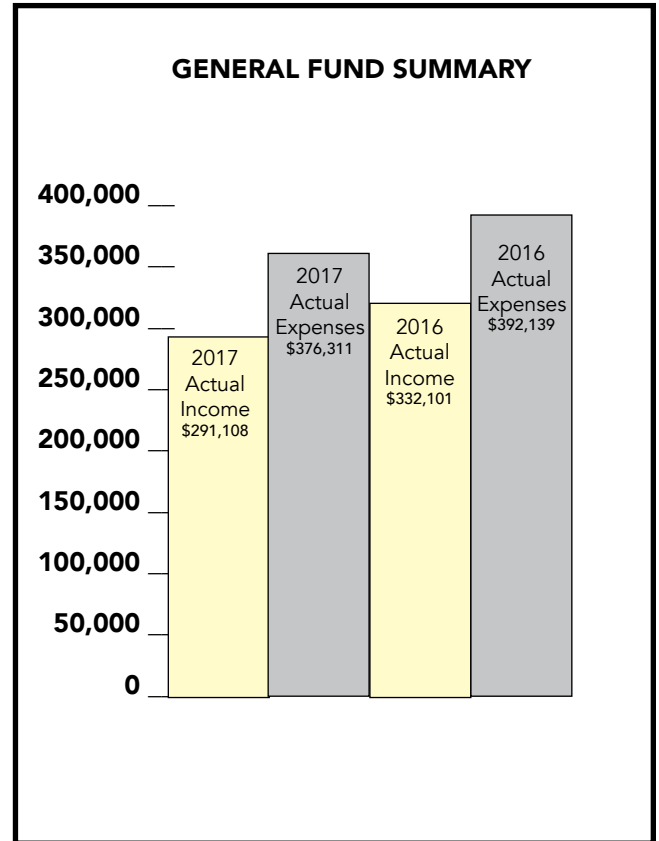
