## Dear Friends and Members of St. Mark's United Methodist Church,

One of our United Methodist Bishops shared an experience. He was having breakfast with another pastor. As they talked, the waitress came with coffee and took their order. A couple of minutes later she returned to check on them.

"Excuse me," she said, "but did I hear you talking about Jesus?" The Bishop replied that they were indeed speaking of Jesus.

The waitress shared with them that she had been away from the church for quite some time but wanted to return. She was encouraged to find a church, assuring her that she would be warmly welcomed.

This experience got me thinking. What do people hear me saying when I am out and about? There are people that we come in contact with on a daily basis who would want to hear that God loves them. There are people who want to hear about Jesus. There are people who would welcome a personal invitation to attend church with you. We need to be attentive to opportunities to share our faith with other people. Conversations about Jesus should come naturally.

Jesus gave us the Great Commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:29) and also the Great Commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28: 19-20) Because we care about the well-being of all God's children, we should not hesitate to show our love and concern. We want others to discover what we have found to be true in Jesus. So, we go about being intentional in sharing our faith, witnessing, and teaching about Jesus.



When the waitress returned with their food, she continued the conversation. She had been thinking about returning to church for several years but had never followed through. She had good intentions but lacked the courage to attend. Again the pastors tenderly encouraged her to find a church.

What would you say to this woman? What words of encouragement might you offer? This summer may we remain alert for opportunities to share the good news of our faith.

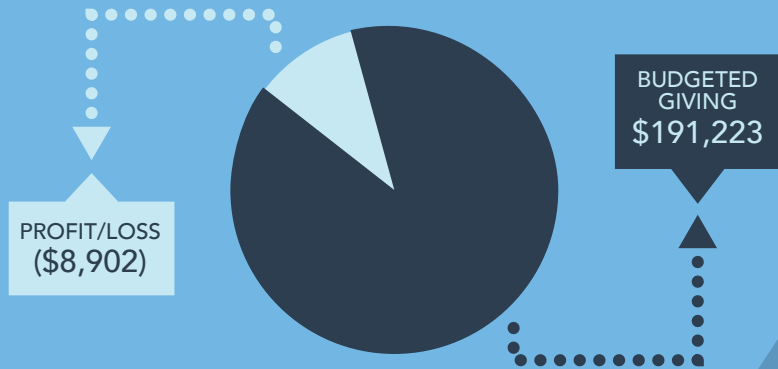

This month's Profit / Loss of \$8,902 reflects a \$5,600 gain in income during the past month.

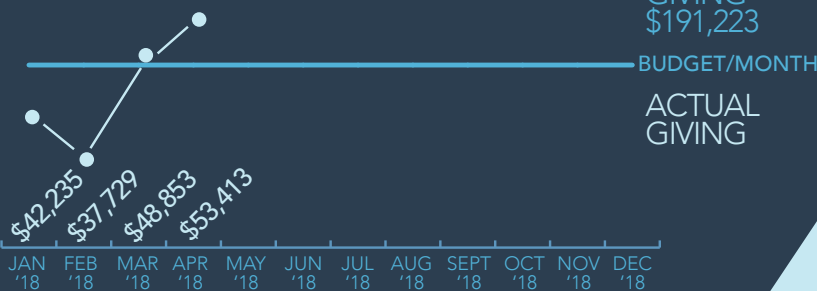
